# 122/16 8. **Open Spaces** Wildlife Flower Meadow/Orchard: The Blackpool and Fylde Bee Keepers approved the information artwork for the display sign, which has now been ordered. To provide essential food and shelter for the bees, further work will be required on the meadow utilising the Tesco Grant monies. It was resolved that work to strip the meadow, removing vegetation and a degree of soil be commissioned. The dyke will also require clearance. The stream has been cleared by volunteers who have saved the logs from trees for "bug hives". Britain in Bloom: The Parish Council expressed its gratitude to the Britain in Bloom volunteers who have worked tirelessly during this busy time preparing the village for the Competition. Green Flag: It was noted that Elswick Village Hall and Gardens have successfully been awarded the Green Flag Award in recognition of the well managed open spaces. Tesco Local Community Grant Scheme: £6K of the £8K grant from Tesco has been received. This grant was awarded for the local project to improve the meadow. This fund is administrated by Groundwork who continually monitor spend and will be visiting the site to inspect works to date. Best Kept Garden Competition: to be judged next week. Playing Field Hedge: It was noted that the playing field hedge required cutting back. It was resolved that a contractor would be sourced for this work to be carried out. 123/16 9. **Amenity Cleansing** Nil to report 124/16 10. **County & Borough Council** To receive and consider any Parish issues and resolve any actions: FBC: Public Space protection orders: Public Space Protection Orders, or PSPOs, came into existence last year under the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. PSPOs allow for broad powers to criminalise behaviour that is not normally criminal. A working group of elected members from FBC has been formed to consider the introduction of PSPOs for Dog Control and other potential sources of anti-social behaviour. FBC: Elswick Neighbourhood Plan Consultation: The application is out for a six week public consultation commencing on Thursday 16 June 2016 and will end at 5pm on Thursday 28 July 2016. Representations can be made in numerous ways either online or by paper copies available from FBC or in the Village Hall. 125/16 11. **Finance** It was resolved to approve the monthly bank reconciliation for July 2016 It was resolved to approve the cumulative budget report for July 2016. Councillors acknowledged overspends in the following areas: Maintenance contingency: 1147.84 (tree work and bus shelter refurb) Admin Sundries: 203.34 (website update) Britain in Bloom: 43.06 (additional planting) Britain in Bloom Contingency: 108.47 (additional planting) Wildflower Meadow: 153.51 (rotovation) Unbudgeted Spend: 7,709.95 (Village hall plant bed and election costs) Income Received: FBC Britain in Bloom £350, Tesco Grant £6,000 HMRC Bank Mandate: It was noted that this mandate has still not been renewed. In order to follow bank protocol Cllrs Read, Rowe and Hudson are required to visit the HSBC bank for ID checks.
